Description of the Tables above

Table 1 provides a summary of College's Fees paid directly to the College's Bank Accounts. These fees cover tuition, Students' Council (US\$ 20) and NACTE Annual Examinations (US \$ 40). These fees plus fees for accommodation on College's campus must be paid in full or in two instalments of 50% at the beginning of each semester. No student shall be allowed into the campus without paying College's Fees. College's Fees are subject to change annually to reflect changing economic and financial circumstances. Customers shall be informed accordingly.

Table 2 provides a summary of annual **estimated** costs to students on services and equipment that are not offered by the College. Some of these services and equipment are compulsory (*) and some are optional (**).

Note that students will not be allowed to participate in the field training without standard uniforms that can be obtained at the College. Students shall also be required to bring their own beddings, if they opt to take College's accommodation.

The College is in the process of reviewing the Advanced Diploma in Wildlife Management that will be replaced by the Higher Diploma in Wildlife Management. Therefore enrolment of students into the Advanced Diploma was stopped in August, 2008.

GENERAL INFORMATION



The College of African Wildlife Management, Mweka situated on the slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro was founded in 1963. It is registered by the National Council for Technical Education (NACTE) in Tanzania and a recognised Centre of Excellence by the East African Community (EAC) and the Southern African Development Community (SADC). Since its establishment the College has trained over 4,600 students from 51 countries worldwide (28 African and 23 non-African countries). It is mandated to provide demand articulated training, research and consultancy services in African wildlife conservation and management.

VISION

To be a Centre of Excellence in providing professional and technical training, research and consultancy services in African wildlife management, and wildlife tourism.

MISSION

To provide high standards of relevant professional and technical training to meet the needs of African Wildlife Organisations for qualified and competent management staff.

This would be achieved through:

- ? Provision of relevant and diverse range of practical wildlife management training; and
- ? Carrying out research and consultancy that enhance training capacity.

TRAINING PROGRAMMES

The College currently offers the following long course training:

? Special Course in Wildlife Management	4 months
? Technician Certificate in Wildlife Management	1 year
? Technician Certificate in Wildlife Tourism	1 year
? Technician Certificate in Tourist Hunting	1 year
? Ordinary Diploma in Wildlife Tourism	2 years
? Ordinary Diploma in Wildlife Management	2 years
? Postgraduate Diploma in Wildlife Management	1 year

The College also offers a variety of short-term training options to meet the training needs of its clients.

Long course programs are structured in modular format. Students can attend modules on long course timetable as short courses. These are modular short-courses and duration can vary from two to four weeks.

The College offers tailor-made short courses off campus or a combination of on campus and field oriented short courses. Off campus short courses are also known outreach programs. Duration, purpose and learning outcomes of tailor-made courses vary depending on customer learning needs.

COLLEGE FACILITIES

Training and Field Safaris

The College has up-to-date training facilities, including a new training block consisting of classrooms, academic staff offices and a fully equipped computer laboratory for training and student use. The College also has a well-stocked library, which maintains a collection of more than 6,000 publications relevant to wildlife management.

For field training, the College has access to Tanzania's world famous protected areas such as Serengeti National Park, and Ngorongoro Conservation Area. The College manages the Kwakuchinja Study Area located in the migration corridor between Tarangire and Lake Manyara National Parks.

Accommodation and Catering

Recently built and refurbished student hostel accommodation is available for about 334 students on a non shared and shared occupancy basis. Rooms are allocated to students on a first-come first-pay basis. For those who will not be accommodated on campus by the College will get accommodation in Moshi town (12 km from the College) or at Mweka and Sungu villages adjacent to the College.

Public transport between Mweka and Moshi is not very reliable but students staying off campus can organize themselves and arrange for transport from Moshi on terms to be decided by a group of students and the owner of the transport facility.
